

BEFORE CANADA DOUGH

Kevin George is a fourth-year Computer Science student at Waterloo who was searching for a summer job, consulted Canada Dough to edit his Resume, and ultimately landed a Software Developer co-op at a game studio.

Kevin's Advice to Job Seekers



Take your career / job search seriously and start working on it early to get better results (ex. Starting from your second co-op)



If you're looking for a programming role, it's important to build a website, get involved with projects and create a LinkedIn page or potentially try networking



Having someone look over your Resume can be super helpful. They can give you a new perspective on your Resume, and how to improve.



Practice interview questions to be as prepared as possible. You don't know when your next interview will be - and the process can transition to interviews.
